Authors' Guidelines for Hungarian Agricultural Research, environmental management, land use, biodiversity full-paper submission

Procedure for publishing

Full-papers will first be checked for formal requirements. Only those fulfilling formal standards will be considered for peer-review. Authors are kindly asked to follow the formatting instructions.

General information about the paper's content

Research papers should report an experimental or theoretical new and original study/review that is relevant to agricultural issues. Customary standards apply: relevance, originality, significance, validity, and clarity. Article should be understandable to readers from a wide range of backgrounds, not just people in the authors' specialty.

Arrangement and format of papers

All papers are to be submitted in Microsoft Word format, in English. Paper's character limit is 15.000. Spaces and punctuation marks count as characters.

Manuscripts should be prepared according to the following structure:

- The title page should include:
 - The name(s) of the author(s)
 - A concise and informative title
 - The affiliation(s) and address(es) of the author(s)
 - The e-mail address, telephone and fax numbers of the corresponding author
- An abstract of 200 to 400 words, suitable for readers from a broad range of agricultural disciplines. It should avoid highly specialized terminology that might be appropriate for a single-discipline journal. Take particular care that the significance of the work is made clear, even to readers from a different field.
- Subject matter keywords suitable for use in scientific indexing
- The text, divided under appropriate headings including preferably the following sections:

- Introduction Setting the context of the work and giving the reader access to a summary of the most relevant recent literature on the topic; concluding with a clearly stated aim for the work.
- Material and methods Including criteria for case study selection if relevant.
- Results Clearly summarized with appropriate statistical analysis (if relevant).
- Discussion Critical appraisal of the results in the light of the study aim and previous published findings/hypotheses.
- Conclusions These should not simply be a summary of the previous results and discussion section but should integrate key points or draw out recommendations.
- Acknowledgements (if any)
- References (for further information about presenting references please see below)
- Tables: embedded in text and also attached in separate file. Tables should be numbered consecutively with Arabic numerals and every table should be mentioned at least once in the text. Table caption should be placed above the graphic:

• Figures and charts: embedded in text and also attached in separate files. Caption of figures and chars should be placed below the graphic similarly to table's caption:

Format of papers

All papers are to be submitted in Microsoft Word format, in English preferably.

- The entire manuscript, including abstract and references, should be typed on an A4 size paper, single spaced, with 2.5 cm margins on all four sides. All text are to be justified with page numbers in the bottom middle.
 - ◆ Use 12 point Times New Roman normal, plain font for text.
 - Use uppercase for title, author/s and headings.
 - ✤ Use italics for emphasis.
 - ✤ Do not use field functions.
 - ✤ Use the equation editor or MathType for equations.
 - Save your file in docx format (Word 2007 or higher) or doc format (older Word versions).
 - Illustrations, pictures and graphs should be supplied with the highest quality:
 - Use at least 300dpi resolution for images in JPG, EPS or TIFF image format retaining the quality when enlarging/zooming in and send them also in separate file (not only embedded in text)
 - Use JPG, EPS or TIFF format for graphs and send them also on separate file.
- Headings

Please use no more than three levels of displayed headings.

- Abbreviations
 - ✤ Abbreviations should be defined at first mention and used consistently thereafter.
- Footnotes
 - Instead of substantive footnotes, include the material in the main text or consider eliminating it.
- Acknowledgments
 - Acknowledgments of people, grants, funds, etc. should be placed in a separate section before the reference list. The names of funding organizations should be written in full.

<u>Units</u>

Research papers should use the International (SI, or metric) system throughout. Occasional use of common unit equivalents in parentheses is permitted.

Reference List

References should be numbered consecutively in the order in which they first appear in the text using superscript Arabic numerals. Where a reference is cited more than once in the text, use the same number each time. In the reference list please give the names of all authors in the reference, never use "et al.". The reference list uses no quotation marks, italics, boldface or underlining. Only the names of books and periodicals are in initial capitals. Names of papers, book chapters, pamphlets, and bulletins are not capitalized.
